Hawaii Modular Space Donates \$15,000 to Hawaii Literacy.

(Honolulu, HI—May 18, 2006)—Hawaii Literacy received \$15,000 from Hawaii Modular Space, Inc. (HMSI) as part of its Makana Hui award program.

HMSI, a licensed general contractor, is a full-service distributor of modular buildings statewide. In business since 1987, HMSI is the leading modular space distributor in Hawai'i with 50 employees at its local office in Campbell Industrial Park.

HMSI chose Hawaii Literacy for its dedication to helping people gain knowledge and skills by providing literacy and life long learning services. Hawaii Literacy's programs include one-to-one tutoring, free evening reading and writing classes to non-native English speakers, and referral service for all literacy programs and agencies throughout the state. Hawaii Literacy's bookmobile also visits housing projects on the Waianae Coast to offer books, computers, and other literacy activities to residents of all ages.

The spaces can be built pre-wired for high-tech industry. HMSI's subsidiary, Alaska Modular Space, Inc. serves Alaska.
