Hawaii Modular Space Wins International Awards

(Honolulu, Hawai'i – April 15, 2003) – Local businessman Mike Fox brought home several awards from the International Modular Building Institute's Annual Convention & Trade Show. Fox is president of Hawaii Modular Space, Inc. (HMSI)

HMSI won Best of Show for both their own corporate office in Kapolei and Schofield Army Headquarters. They took first place for the Schofield Army Headquarters (for temporary offices over 5,000 square feet). First place was also received for the Seamaids Bikini Shop, Haleiwa (for temporary single-wide modules). Finally, HMSI came away with an honorable mention for the Waipahu Police Training Academy (for permanent educational buildings under 5,000 square feet).

HMSI, a licensed general contractor, is a full-service distributor of modular buildings statewide. In business since 1987, HMSI is the leading modular space distributor in Hawai'i with 39 employees at its local office in Campbell Industrial Park. Its subsidiary, Alaska Modular Space, serves Alaska.

The spaces can be built wired for high-tech industry.
